From the Pastor:

Brothers and Sisters in Jesus,

I've heard a lot of droopy prayers in my life. Hey, I've prayed them too.

- Prayers of desperation—God, you've got to help me!
- Prayers of self-pity—God, things are so awful.
- Prayers of resignation—God, if you want to leave me unemployed, then I can't stop you!

But I'm learning how to pray a different kind of prayer—prayers said with thanksgiving. I learned it from St. Paul, who writing from prison, taught me a powerful lesson. Paul said, "Do not be anxious about anything but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving present your request to God." Strange. Here, Paul is suffering in horrible prison conditions, yet he's telling me to pray with thanksgiving? No matter what was happening to him, he was always rejoicing.

Thanksgiving is the seasoning that makes our prayers edible to God. After all, who wants to hear people whine all the time? I've learned you can not whine and give thanks in the same breath. Self-pity and thankfulness don't mix any better than oil and water.

In fact, mixing thanks with prayer somehow changes it. When we remember what God has done for us in the past and think about who He is in the present and express that in thankfulness; our prayers become more gentle, more trusting somehow. Thankful prayers are offered with faith and faith is an essential ingredient for prayers that God chooses to answer.

We remember the pilgrims on Thanksgiving Day, not so much for their turkey dinner, but for the sheer faith that inspired them to give thanks in a year that saw nearly half their number die of sickness. Yet, they prayed with thanksgiving.

When your annual day of feasting is over, you may be moan your extra helpings of stuffing, mashed potatoes and of course, pumpkin pie. But if you can hang on to the thanks part of thanks giving, you will be a different person. Because when you learn to talk to God about your needs, mixed with a healthy dose of heartfelt thanks, then you have crossed the divide from whining at God to real prayer.

We've got the proverbial good news and bad news.

Let's start with the bad news. Over the summer it was necessary to withdrawal \$8,000 from our money market (savings) account to pay our bills. Unfortunately, over the summer our offerings dip but our bills do not.

Now, let's hear some good news. We did not have to withdraw anything from our money market account to pay for the replacement of the Narthex air conditioner! The total amount was covered by donations and money from our Building Fund (pink monthly envelopes).

New carpeting in the Narthex was installed at the end of October. This was paid from our money market account. New carpeting will also be installed in the Sunday School hallway and the business office. In addition, we are working on upgrading the fellowship hall restrooms. This is a lengthy process. The bequests have allowed us to do some much needed building upgrades.

Fund Raising Committee

When our Church Council representative asked me to prepare a report for this newsletter, I had several thoughts. The most important one was the fact that so many of our members have served on the Fund Raising Committee for several years; but we also have new members that are welcome and we hope will invigorate us with new ideas!

Your Fund Raising Committee actually was formed because of a special congregational meeting held on August 29, 2010 to address a serious shortfall in meeting Good Shepherd's budget for the year. After much discussion about how to accomplish this, and with a depressing mood taking over the meeting, I stood up and suggested some very <u>simple</u> ways we could earn some money. This was, of course, along with some very particular steps that were voted on at that meeting.

Imagine my surprise when many, many people signed their names to a very hastily drawn up signup sheet! It was overwhelming, frankly. And so began the Fund Raising Committee, which was formed then and became a standing committee later and continues on with our purpose in shoring up the General Fund.

After looking over the past 8 years' annual reports, we are pleased to report that at the end of 2018 our committee had raised a total of \$38,886! Hard to believe, but these are the amounts:

2011 -	\$ 2,691	2012 -	1,204
2013 -	2,555	2014 -	4,065
2015 -	5,000	2016 -	7,220
2017 -	8,083	2018 -	8,068

Also, so far in 2019 we have raised another \$1,565.50! The Soup/Bake sale netted \$449.50; Christmas in July brought in \$637.00; and the Redner's tapes so far amount to \$479.00, with more to be tallied.

This brings the total we have added to our General Fund since our inception to \$40,451.50!!

But make no mistake - this is not just about dollars, but is about bringing us together to raise funds to continue the <u>ministry</u> of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. And all of this could not have been done without the support we have received from congregational members and the community. You have all pitched in with whatever we planned, and we thank you. Whether it was soup sales or special events, you were there.

So remember -- this month will be the biggest fund raising event held at Good Shepherd, the 6th Annual Black Friday Penny Party! Please look for the signup sheets on the bulletin board and sign your name where you can help us with this huge undertaking. Thank you!
