From the Pastor:

Brother and Sisters in Jesus,

"Tell me the weight of a snowflake," a coal-mouse (a small bird) asked a wild dove. "Nothing more than nothing," was the answer. "Let me tell you a marvelous story," the coal-mouse said. "I sat on a fir branch, when it began to snow—not heavily, just slowly coming down. Since I didn't have anything better to do today, I counted the snowflakes settling on the twigs and needles of my branch. Their number was exactly 3,741,952. When the 3,741,953 flake dropped onto the branch, nothing more than nothing, as you say, the branch broke off."

Having said that, the coal-mouse flew away. You see, it takes just one snowflake to make a difference, just one.

Every once in a while we are all pestered or haunted by the questions, "Does what I do, or give, or offer, make any difference? Does it mean anything?" Sometimes it doesn't take much to make me wonder. We try and try but we can't seem to get it together or even to inspire someone to follow Jesus.

We live in a society that worships heroes and their great accomplishments. We look at our mundane lives and what we accomplish and it seems like nothing compared to what they do. We see their huge bank accounts and how we barely make our money last from paycheck to paycheck. What did I ever do wrong?

In the Gospel of Luke, a 12 or 13 year old girl is given an extraordinary assignment. Her response was simply, "I am the Lord's servant. May it be me as you have said." In essence, Mary said to the angel, "I am willing to be one snowflake. I am willing to do what I can, with what I have been given, with a full, grateful and willing heart. I am willing to no worry about the outcome. I am willing to no worry what other people think or say. I am willing to do your will as best I can." So why am I afraid to let this be enough?

So, here's the deal: the journey to wholeness is not about me becoming something I'm not. The journey toward wholeness is about reflecting on what is already there, inside each of us. It is all about making a difference by just being you.

Christ, Conyngham Outdoor Worship Space



In early 2016, leaders of Christ, Conyngham began exploring ways to commemorate the 200th anniversary of the congregation in 2018. One of three significant projects identified was restoring a courtyard area located between the buildings housing the sanctuary and Christian Education/ Fellowship spaces. The challenge was to re-imagine the space, taking creation care and reaching out to the community into consideration.

An outdoor worship space looking over the Conyngham Sugarloaf Valley was designed and constructed by ThorneCare Landscape Solutions, a business owned and operated by one of the congregation's young adults. Financing was provided by Mission Investment Fund, which allowed the congregation to use existing funds for giving to the Campaign for the ELCA.

The courtyard project and a parking lot restoration project occurred in tandem, along with the congregation's third anniversary project-giving \$100,000 to the Campaign for the ELCA. Lutheran World Relief Hunger Appeal has been the recipient of \$50,000. Plans include giving \$50,000 to Lutheran Disaster Response in 2017.

The space features a fully accessible worship space and stone altar, a baptismal fountain which pours forth from the altar, and a fire pit for social gathering. The fountain color may be changed based upon the season of the church year. The worship space includes capacity for sound and landscape lighting, and utilizes an open area with pavers marked with the sign of the cross. In addition, a Celebration of Life tree on the wall allows folks to have a leaf engraved with the names of their departed loved ones and two benches by the tree for seating.
