From the Pastor:

Brothers and Sisters in Jesus,

The human heart desires joy. We all desire joy, every family, every people aspires to happiness. But what is the joy that the Christian is called to live out and bear witness to? It is the joy that comes from the closeness of God, from His presence in our life.

From the moment Jesus entered into history, with His birth in Bethlehem, we received the seed of the Kingdom of God, like the soil receives the seed, the promise of a future harvest. There is no need to look any further! Jesus has come to bring joy to all people for all time. 

School Kits

Lutheran World Relief distributes school kits to children whose families are unable to afford education supplies. In the past year, beneficiaries of these school kits have included Ukrainian children displaced by an ongoing war, Turkish youngsters uprooted by devastating earthquakes, and Mali refugee families forced to abandon their farms due to the effect of the expanding Sahara Desert. These children face serious challenges, but they want and need an education.

The Social Ministry Committee is collecting the essential education supplies needed for these school kits. The supplies that we are collecting are:

- -- 70-sheet spiral bound notebooks of wide or college ruled paper, approx. 8 x 10 1/2 inches (no loose-leaf paper)
- -- 30 centimeter rulers, or a ruler with centimeters on one edge and inches on the other
- -- pencil sharpeners (small ones)
- -- blunt scissors (such as safety scissors with steel blades)
- -- unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- -- black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- -- boxes of 16 or 24 crayons
- -- erasers, approx. 2 1/2 inches long



The supplies for each child are packed in cloth drawstring bags. Sandy Newhard has generously sewn over 100 of the bags, and we want to fill all of them.

Items will be collected until September 10, so keep your eyes open for back-to-school sales.

If you prefer not to go shopping, monetary donations will be accepted to use to purchase supplies. Checks may be made payable to "Good Shepherd Lutheran Church" and note that the funds are for school kit supplies.

Donations may be brought to church and placed in the donation box in the Narthex on Sundays during worship, or on weekdays Monday thru Thursday from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. (use the back entrance by the church office).
