From the Pastor:

Brothers and sisters in Jesus,

Over the past few weeks, I have been longing for spring and Easter but before we get there we have to go through Lent. Lent comes from the Latin root meaning, "to lengthen." It reminds us that during the season of spring, the sun takes a little longer each evening to settle beyond the horizon. With this, the weather grows warmer and life emerges once more. Lent is our connecting point to the season of life.

But Lent is a messy season. As the snows of winter lie on the ground, things get covered, trampled and wind blown. As the snow melts, we are left to discover the trash, the litter and the mud beneath the snow.

It is much like our lives. Over time, our hearts and souls, when left unattended, get messy. Lent invites us to deal with the mess. This is not about quickly cleaning things up and pretending they were never there, nor is it about ignoring the mess. Lent invites us to roll up our sleeves and sort through the debris of our lives.

Remember the words of Ash Wednesday; "remember you are dust and to dust you shall return." We are mortals and at the same time, created in the image of God. We are faced with our utter brokenness and staring at our sins searching our hearts.

This is what Lent does. It allows us to see the parts of ourselves we'd rather cover up. It asks us to drag out full self into the light of day, no matter how dark it may be. As we near the end of Lent, we encounter Good Friday; a day we look upon the horrendous death of Jesus.

Lent and Good Friday invite us to brush against the death of Jesus as we sort through the death in our own hearts. Good Friday is the moment when Jesus' death and our sin crash into one another and in that moment, we ache for Easter.

And so, as we enter into the Lenten season, may we remember we are dust and to dust we shall return. May we examine our frail, flawed soul and with Jesus, enter the darkness of our sin and death and journey with Him to the cross. May we anticipate the glorious day of Easter and hear those beautiful words: "He is Risen!" Yours in Jesus,

Happy New Year Good Shepherd Congregational Members.

As a reminder, congregational members who have Thrivent accounts may be eligible to direct yearly profits earned by Thrivent, **but not from your personal account earnings**, to a charitable organization of your choice, **Good Shepherd being one of**

them. Your accounts may qualify for what Thrivent calls Choice Dollars, which is money Thrivent will donate to an organization selected by you. This is how Thrivent partners with its account holders in a joint effort to give back to the community. Please keep Good Shepherd in mind when reviewing your eligibility for these choice dollars.

To review your Choice Dollars eligibility please follow these steps:

- 1. Visit Thrivent.com/thriventchoice
- 2. In the Direct Choice Dollars section on the right, select the "Get started now" link
- 3. Log in and enter your user ID and password, and answer your security question. (If you have not registered on Thrivent.com, click: Register for account access.")
- 4. Find the number of Choice Dollars available to direct on the right side of the screen. Locate the organization you want to direct to:

To direct to a previous organization:

Click "Direct Now" next to the organization name; or

On the Activity History page scroll down and click the name of the desired organization.

To direct to a new organization, enter keywords like organization name, zip, etc.. Click "FIND"

Click "Direct ALL or enter a specific number and click, "Direct Now." Follow the prompts on the confirmation window to direct Choice Dollars.

If Members are unsure if they receive Choice Dollars or if they would like to direct them but do not utilize Thrivent online, they should contact their representative or call 1-800-THRIVENT for assistance.

Members have until March to donate Choice Dollars from the previous calendar year.

Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod, ELCA

A New Ministry Partnership

On December 1, 2016, Nativity and St. Paul, Reading, entered into a ministry partnership when they agreed to share Geert Ruelens as their musician. On Monday evening, both choirs rehearse together; and in 2017 the two congregations joined in celebrating Epiphany and Ascension (to which they invited the community); and they worshiped together on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and for the Easter Vigil.

When Nativity's interim pastor, Cathy Feil, received a call, St. Paul and Nativity saw an opportunity to deepen their partnership. They entered into fruitful discussions about sharing a pastor, guided by the Holy Spirit and Associate of the Bishop, Rev. John C. Richter. On August 1 St. Paul's pastor, Carol B. Kehler, began serving also at Nativity after an agreement was reached to purchase time from St. Paul. On August 6, Pastor Richter offered prayers for the beginning of a new ministry at Nativity.

Congregational leaders join in Worship and Music Committee meetings as well as in a quarterly Council meeting to evaluate the ongoing partnership. Members have four weekly opportunities for Worship, two for Bible study, and share Eucharistic ministers. The congregations look forward to sharing both another Epiphany celebration as well as an Advent 4 service on December 24 (for which a bell choir will be formed).

Between Nativity and St. Paul, 74 families received a Thanksgiving basket containing a full meal, prayerfully offered by the congregations. As the congregations look to influence each other in the best of ways, St. Paul has adopted Nativity's yearly Women's Thankoffering and Nativity members have contributed food, clothing, and household donations to St. Paul's monthly Food Pantry. St. Paul and Nativity will continue trusting in God's guidance as they look to the future together.

Second Annual Parish Secretaries' Christmas Lunch

On Tuesday, December 12, the synod support staff hosted the 2nd Annual Parish Secretaries' Christmas Lunch. All NEPS congregations were encouraged to treat their parish secretaries to a time of fellowship and a catered lunch. The group had an opportunity to ask questions of



the synod's support staff, play some Christmas games, make new friends, and reconnect with old friends.

WHITE PRIVILEGE CONFERENCE

St. Paul, White Haven Community Lunch Program



St. Paul, White Haven is a small church in a small town; but church members and helpful friends serve approximately 3,400 meals a year to anyone who stops by for lunch on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday.

The church's Community Lunch Program has been in place for years; but in 2014 Sherry Legg, St. Paul's Secretary, thought the community needed a communal celebration - a free Thanksgiving dinner. Encouraged by commitments from an informal social media poll, Sherry organized her husband and their four kids, her parents, extended family and friends, and they served 163 guests for dinner on Thanksgiving Eve.

Billed as The Second Annual White Haven Community Thanksgiving Dinner, the 2015 event attracted nearly 200 guests in a raging snowstorm that knocked out power briefly, panicking the kitchen workers.



By 2016, with 258 guests, the event had truly become a community tradition. The high school Key Club showed up to help, St. Patrick's RCC members roasted turkeys, and Boy and Girl Scouts helped set up and decorate. The local ambulance crew delivered meals to shut-ins, and the

Lions Club wrote a check. This year the White Haven Market donated turkeys, and Thrivent sent a donation.

The 2017 guest numbers grew to 317, which is nearly 30 percent of the population of White Haven.
