

If you feel that you would be interested in doing so, please speak with our president, Nicole or Pastor Gary.



Treasurer Report – December 2022

We had income in December of \$9,670, which decreased our net loss position to \$6,800. Some notable activity for the month is the following:

Monthly offerings were approximately \$25,100. We had a great fundraising event that raised \$7,300. Some other notable activity includes:

\$240 for choir music purchased from Music Fund

\$470 for Flowers

\$330 for Organ Maintenance

\$370 Paid to TDS Technology

\$245 for offering envelopes

\$170 Gift Cards for Employees

\$925 for fundraising expenses (Jess Fin Foundation (\$800) and Gaming License (\$125)) Net \$6,375 from Fundraising Event

\$500 Paid to SMEEC for maintenance

\$1,379 for Defibrillator paid for by Memorial Fund

At the end of December, we had \$12,100 in checking account. Our savings account has a balance of \$14,100 which is unchanged from the prior month. Plan on transferring amounts from Checking Account to Savings Account in January.

There is about \$2,100 in outstanding checks that will clear in the upcoming days. See A/P Aging Summary for details.

Total assets, all bank accounts and CDs, were \$184,000 at December 31, 2022 compared to \$190,000 at December 31, 2021.


