From the Pastor:

Brothers and sisters in Jesus,

One of my favorite parables is the Prodigal Son. Prodigal means a person who is wasteful of their money and possessions. I also think it also describes the father/God. The adjective meaning of prodigal fits the father perfectly: giving or yielding profusely; very generous. A perfect description of our forgiving God.

We all know the story, how the son took his part of his inheritance and spent it on gambling, wine and women. When he was totally destitute, he took care of swine. A Jewish boy taking care of swine is as low as one could go in work. He was hungry and was actually looking at the food he was feeding the swine as a delicious meal for himself. He didn't eat it. His mind kept going back to all he had as a son or even how well the servants were treated.

So he leaves his job and begins walking home. This was the first step to forgiveness. He realized his mistakes and how bad he messed up his life. He wants his father's love and concern once more even if he is treated as a servant.

His father saw him and ran to him and called him Beloved. He swept His son into His arms and held him, telling him how much He missed him and loved him. Jesus told His followers that God was not a punitive judge but a lover, who wants us back into His loving family. He forgives us and remembers our sins no more.

We are the prodigal children who run away from God to do what we want to do. We need to realize that while we are away from Him, God has been trying to find us, to know us and to love us. The question is not "How am I to find God?" but "How am I to let myself be know by Him?" And the question is not "How am I to love God?" but "How am I to let myself be loved by God?" You see God is looking into the distance for us, trying to find us and longing to bring us Home. He will hug us and tell us how much He misses us and much He loves us.

We proudly present Renae's Coconut Tossies

Preheat oven to 350 <u>Dough: (Mix with fork and hands)</u> 2 cups four dash of salt 6 oz cream cheese 1/2 lb. butter Chill at least 1hr or overnight



<u>Filling:</u> Beat 4 eggs 1 cup brown sugar 2 tsp lemon juice

1 cup sugar 8 tsp. melted margarine 3 cups coconut

Press dough into mini muffin pan., saving room for the filling in the center. Add filling mixture into each muffin cup. Don't over fill. Bake for 18–20 minutes until golden brown.

Note: Renae says that she usually has extra filling, which she places in custard cups and bakes.



LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF

School Kits

As a result of war and natural disasters, families around the world need help providing essential school

supplies so that their children can continue their education despite facing serious obstacles. The Social Ministry Committee is collecting school supplies to pack into drawstring backpacks for distribution by Lutheran World Relief.

The supplies that we are collecting are:

-- 70-sheet spiral bound notebooks of wide or college ruled paper, approx. 8 x 10 1/2 inches (no loose-leaf paper)

- -- 30 centimeter rulers, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- -- pencil sharpeners (small ones)
- -- blunt scissors (such as safety scissors with steel blades)
- -- unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- -- black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- -- boxes of 16 or 24 crayons
- -- erasers, approx. 2 1/2 inches long

Items will be collected until September 8, so keep your eyes open for back-to-school sales.

If you prefer not to go shopping, monetary donations will be accepted to use to purchase

supplies. Checks may be made payable to "Good Shepherd Lutheran Church" and noted that the funds are for school kits.

Donations may be brought to church and placed in the donation box in the Narthex on Sundays during

worship, or on weekdays from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. (use the back entrance by the church office).

This service project has been approved as a Thrivent Action Team project.
