Dear Friends:

In January I asked you all to consider serving on Church Council. I have spoken to some of you, and other council members have approached still more of you. At the end of the year we will have two people who cannot serve again for a year because our Constitution specifies that. With two other openings unfilled, we could be looking at four open positions. That puts the decision making process of this church into the hands of a very small number of people and the problem is not going away.

Ben Bogdan is currently chairing a search committee, so we will keep asking you. However, the time has come to make decisions on how future councils can run. At our Congregational meeting we will have this discussion on the formal agenda for your input. We may have to formally change the number of people on Council in our Constitution. That would not be my first choice. We may also look at extending years of possible service or changing term limits requirements. The obvious danger of that is electing Council members "for life" and growing stagnant on new ideas to grow the church. This is a difficult discussion, and one that we need your help to resolve. Please come to our Congregational Meeting with some ideas and some opinions on what we should do. Any changes we decide to make to our Constitution require two meetings and a vote. Let this serve as notice that your church council intends for our meeting in April to be meeting #1. And of course, it is never too late to decide you are willing to serve on Council to help us make our church better!

In the month of February, we had a loss of \$1,400 due to an increase in maintenance work, property insurance, and snow removal. The total loss for the year is \$3,800.

At the end of February, we had a balance of \$3,470 in our checking account. Our savings account has a balance of \$40,000. There is about \$2,000 in outstanding checks that will clear in the upcoming days.


