

31st Cookie Sale



Special thanks from Social Ministry to all the people who took time during this busy time of year to deliver the cookies.







Mardi Gras Talent Show & Pot Luck

January is the coldest month in the Northern Hemisphere and the warmest month in the Southern Hemisphere.




Help Wanted!!


