



LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF SCHOOL KITS

As a result of war and natural disasters, families around the world face serious obstacles to obtaining school supplies so that their children can receive an education. The Social Ministry Committee is assembling drawstring backpacks with essential supplies for distribution by **Lutheran World Relief.**

We are off to a wonderful start! Members of our congregation donated fabric for the backpacks. Three talented seamstresses – Cindy Evans, Judy Fehr, and Roseann Yelles – have constructed over 190 bags from that fabric.

Now we need to gather school supplies to fill the bags! You can help by either purchasing needed items or making a monetary donation which we will use to purchase items. Donations will be accepted from **August 1 until September 8.** There will be a donation table in the Narthex for Sunday donations or donations may be brought to church on weekdays from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. (use the back entrance by the church office). Checks should be made payable to "Good Shepherd Lutheran Church" and note that the funds are for school kits.

The supplies that go into each backpack are:

- -- 70-sheet spiral bound notebooks of wide or college ruled paper, approx. 8 x 10 1/2 inches (no loose-leaf paper)
- -- 30 centimeter rulers, or a ruler with centimeters on one edge and inches on the other
- -- pencil sharpeners (small ones)
- -- blunt scissors (such as safety scissors with steel blades)
- -- unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- -- black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- -- boxes of 16 or 24 crayons
- -- erasers, approx. 2 1/2 inches long

BOXES! We need boxes to pack our school kits for shipment to Lutheran World Relief. The ideal box size is 12 by 18 inches, but larger and smaller sizes can be used. Boxes can be brought to church during the Secretary's hours Monday thru Friday 9-2 or on Sunday mornings.









Lutheran World Relief School Kits

During August we collected supplies to fill school bags for Lutheran World Relief. Now it is time to prepare those supplies so that we can pack them into the bags and then box the kits for shipping to LWR.

We will meet on Thursday September 11 at 1 PM at church. Many tasks can be done sitting down. We will be removing packaging, rubber banding pens and pencils, and gathering the eight school items into the bags. Everyone is invited to join us for a time of service and fellowship. Refreshments will be served.




