Cookies And More Bake Sale!

The Good Shepherd Cookie Sale is returning on December 10 at 9 AM with some new twists! It will be held at the same time as the Basket Raffle and Indoor Yard Sale. So, dust off those cookie and special dessert recipes and plan to bake a batch or two of your favorite treats. We need many varieties from all of our congregation members to make the sale a success!

Due to COVID concerns, we will be organizing our bake sale a little differently than in previous years. Each shopper will be given a box as in past years.
