Brothers and Sisters in Jesus,

I want to share with you an article a member shared with me from the "Our Town" reader/ It is called "You Took My Parking Space." This should wake us up.

One day a man went to visit a church. He got there early, parked his car and got out. Another car pulled up, near the driver, got out and said; "I always park there! You took my place!"

The visitor went inside for Sunday school, found an empty seat and sat down. A young lady from the church approached him and stated, "That's my seat! You took my place!" The visitor was somewhat distressed by this rude welcome but said nothing.

After Sunday school the visitor went into the sanctuary and sat down. Another member walked up to him and said, "That's where I always sit! You took my place!" The visitor was even more troubled by the treatment but still he said nothing.

Later, as the congregation was praying for Christ to dwell among them, the visitor stood up and his appearance began to change. Horrible scars became visible on his hands and on his sandaled feet. Someone from the congregation noticed him and called out, "What happened to you?"

The visitor replied, as his hat became a crown of thorns and a tear fell from his eye, "I took your place."

This is a very powerful little story. So, I ask the question: "How do you treat those who are visiting?" Are you gracious, welcoming and warm? We never know who it is that might be visiting us.

Good Shepherd Committees The Spotlight Is On You Scouting

Good Shepherd is blessed to have growing Scouting programs. Cub Scout Pack 40 started in September 2013 with 8 boys and now has over 30. Scouts, BSA Troop 40 for boys started in March 2018 with 10 Scouts and now has grown to 18. In the fall of 2019, we will be starting a Scouts, BSA Troop for girls. All groups participate in service projects such as Scouting for Food, stream cleanups, projects for the church and more.

Cub Scout Pack 40 meets on Tuesday nights 6:45PM to 8:00PM in Fellowship hall. Pack 40 is open to boys and girls in Kindergarten through 5th grade. Cub Scouting is fun for the whole family. In Scouting, boys and girls start with their best right now selves and grow into their very best future selves. It's fun, hands-on learning and achievement that puts kids in the middle of the action and prepares them for today – and for life. Every year the Pack has boys working on the Religious Emblem program and you can see them award on Scout Sunday. The pack is very active and does a lot of outside activities such as camping, hiking, and fishing. Every summer the Pack goes to summer camp at Akelaland Cub Scout Camp at Trexler Scout Reservation.

Pack 40 has a sign-up night on Tuesday September 10, 6:30PM to 8:00PM at Fellowship Hall.

Scouts, BSA Troop 40 for Boys meets on Tuesday nights 7:00PM to 8:30PM in the Scout Room. Troop 40 is for boys 11 through 17 years of age. Scouts BSA is the traditional Scouting experience for youth in the fifth grade through high school. Service, community engagement and leadership development become increasingly important parts of the program as youth lead their own activities and work their way toward earning Scouting's highest rank, Eagle Scout. The troop is very active and tries to do at least one campout or outdoor weekend activity a month. They camp out in all kinds of weather, mostly rain though. This summer they had 11 scouts attend camp at Settler's Camp at Trexler Scout Reservation. They earned a total of 59 merit badges.

You can come to any Troop 40 meeting to sign up to join. Tuesdays at 7:00PM.

Scouts, BSA Troop 540 for Girls is being organized. It is open to girls 11 through 17 years of age. No meeting time has been set yet. They will be able to do the same things that Troop 40 does, including earn the rank of Eagle Scout.

SCHOOL KITS FOR LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF

The Women of the ELCA are assembling school backpack kits for Lutheran World Relief. The backpacks, filled with school supplies, are distributed to children in countries where public school is free, but families must provide all supplies.

The supplies that we are collecting are:

- 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper, approx. 8 x 10 1/2 inches (no loose-leaf paper)
- 30 centimeter rulers, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- pencil sharpeners
- blunt scissors (such as safety scissors with steel blades)
- unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- boxes of 16 or 24 crayons
- erasers, approx. 2 1/2 inches long

We will collect items until September 8, so keep your eyes open for back-to-school sales. If you prefer not to shop, cash donations will be used to purchase supplies. A collection box and jar are in the Narthex.

We will be holding a School Kit Service Activity on Monday, September 16 at 1 PM in the Adult Sunday School Room. We will cut and string the backpack cords, prepare the items for the kits, assemble the kits, and pack them in boxes. Everyone is invited to join us for an afternoon of service and fellowship. Refreshments will be served.

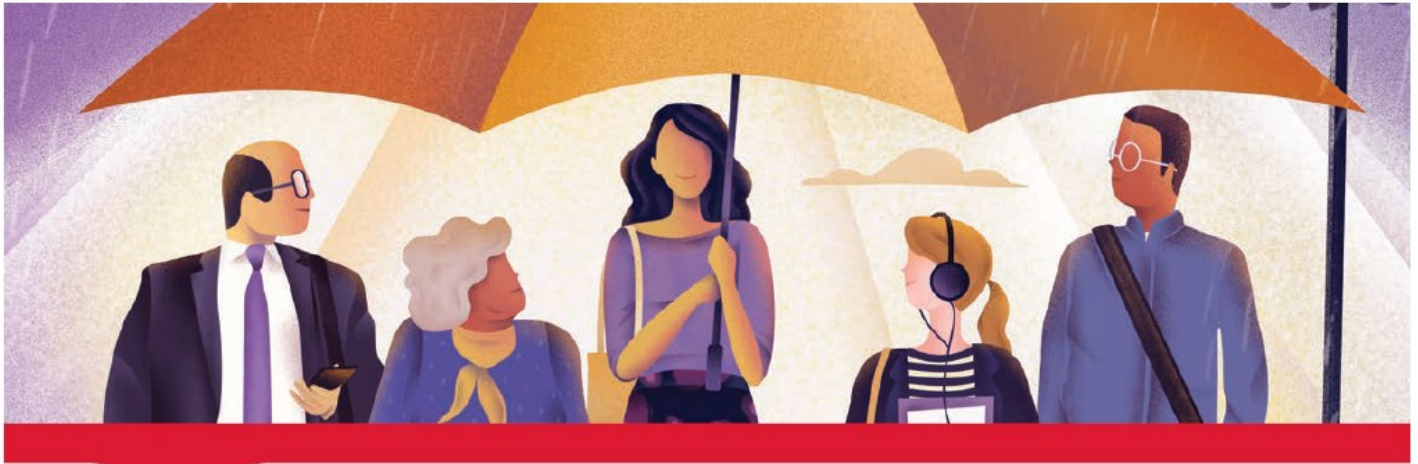

Stewardship of our intelligence and gifts

*Give instruction to the wise, and they will become wiser still;
teach the righteous and they will gain in learning.—Proverbs 9:9*

This month millions of children, youth and adults are back in the classroom for another year of education. At K-12 schools, trade academies, colleges and universities they're training their brains for higher thinking, deepening their knowledge and learning new skills.

These students are not merely drawing on their God-given intelligence and potential, they're actually developing them. What great stewardship of life gifts!

What about the rest of us, we who have ended our formal education? The sad truth is that many of us stop actively learning new things. It's unfortunate, too, because the amazing brains and bodies God has given us have virtually unlimited capacity for learning, growing and developing.

No, we all can't be a Stephen Hawking, Meryl Streep or Michael Jordan, but we can always sharpen our brainpower, express ourselves in the arts and develop our motor skills. In the process, we enrich and expand our lives, and that can lead to greater fulfillment, confidence and opportunity to grow into the fullness that God designs for us. Here are some ideas:

Read. Whether it's biographies, who-done-its, sci-fi, poetry, literature or history, reading not only teaches us things, but it also exercises our brainpower. Start with a commitment to read a book (or two) a month.

Take a class. Many community centers, churches, libraries and senior citizen centers offer enrichment classes on a variety of topics. Learn photography, or conversational Spanish, or quilting. Go deeper: Your local community college may let you "audit" a class for an affordable fee.

Listen or watch. Delve into subjects that interest you by listening to podcasts or watching YouTube videos. Some colleges offer entire lecture series free via podcast or video.

Attend a lecture. Authors, poets, politicians, scientists and entertainers often give public talks at colleges, town halls and other venues.

Write a poem. Or paint a picture, or take a photograph, or pick up a musical instrument. The arts provide a wonderful outlet for our creative selves.

As we watch our children, youth and adults go back to school, let's join them in a commitment to developing the intelligence, skills and abilities that God has given us. It's good stewardship of our lives.
