Pew Candle sponsorships are a beautiful way to honor a loved one or honor your family.






Please, stay tuned for next year's Dine and Donate event schedule. It will be a blast!



Another Thanksgiving has passed. We at Good Shepherd have so much to be thankful for. We were finally able to worship together which is such a great blessing. Oftentimes, God gives us challenges so we can be thankful when we receive his blessings. This year was also filled with some financial challenges. Through October, the church is at a net loss position of \$19,000 and had to use our savings to cover our expenses many months.

Total offerings this year through October is at \$122,000, which is an increase of \$5,000 from the previous year. However, our expenses have increased as well. This year we have been battling septic issues which has cost the church and is the primary cost in our maintenance expense of \$5,100. We also have some large day to day expenses such as our copier lease (\$3,600) and landscaping charges (\$2,900) which are also significant. Our electric has increased significantly. Last year our monthly fees were \$588. Every few months our bill increases and is now over \$1,000 per month.

But through these challenges, God has given us blessings. Our friends at Good Shepherd are looking for ways to reduce our expenses. Pastor has stopped taking mileage checks a few months ago. Our employees didn't receive a pay increase this year; and our office secretary has reduced her hours but continues with the same workload. We are so thankful for their sacrifices.

I am committed to share with all of you more details on our financial challenges every month. I will prepare a letter in the monthly newsletter sharing some of our financial information to offer more visibility. The current financial statements are always posted on the bulletin board. I would be happy to answer any questions you may have. Let's make our goal to break even for FY2023.

The Good Shepherd Cookie Sale is returning on December 10 at 9 AM with some new twists! It will be held at the same time as the Basket Raffle and Indoor Yard Sale. Due to COVID concerns, we will be organizing our bake sale a little differently than in previous years. Each shopper will be given a box as in past years. The baggies will be displayed on tables and shoppers may select the bags they wish to purchase. The cost for cookies will be \$10 a pound, the same price as in 2019.
