When you arrive between 8:30-9am, you must wear a mask and have your temperature taken with a non-contact thermometer. To enter the church, please use only the doors by the bathrooms or the front door. The doors by the office will be locked. No nursery will be available. After you enter the Narthex, you will be handed a baggie with communion in it. Bulletins will be on your seat. Please proceed to the Sanctuary where you will be guided to a seat. We will not sing or do any responsive reading.

The bathrooms will be closed, however, if there is an emergency, you can use the handicapped bathroom.

When the service has ended, you will be excused by pod.

Please do not congregate or visit in the church building or under the portico, please go outside immediately after worship. If you chose to visit outside, please be safe and practice social distancing.

Do not come to church if you are not feeling well or if you have been sick. Our main concern is for everybody to be safe. If you are not comfortable about attending worship, it's okay to stay home.

It will be so wonderful to see your masked faces. I am sure you will be smiling under the mask.

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF School Kits

Education is one of the strongest tools for breaking the cycle of poverty. School Kits contain essential supplies to help children continue learning in the face of serious obstacles. During this period

of worldwide pandemic, more families need help, so the Women of the ELCA are collecting school supplies.

The supplies that we are collecting are:

- -- 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper, approx. 8 x 10 1/2 inches (no loose-leaf paper)
- -- 30 centimeter rulers, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- -- pencil sharpeners (small ones)
- -- blunt scissors (such as safety scissors with steel blades)
- -- unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- -- black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- -- boxes of 16 or 24 crayons
- -- erasers, approx. 2 1/2 inches long

Keep your eyes open for back-to-school sales. If you prefer not to go shopping during this time of social distancing, monetary donations will be accepted to use to purchase supplies. Checks may be made payable to "Good Shepherd Women of the ELCA."

Donations may be brought to church and placed in the box at the front door under the portico on Mondays (except Labor Day) and Fridays from 9:30 AM to 1:30 PM (the same days and times that Social Ministry collects donations for the food bank), and Sunday when we have in-person worship. Items will be collected thru **Monday September 14.**

WELCA thanks Sandy Newhard, who has generously sewn the cloth backpack bags that are used to hold each child's supplies. And WELCA is pleased to announce that this service project has been approved as a Thrivent Action Team project.

Bear Creek Camp Confronts the Pandemic

When COVID-19 forced the suspension of the summer camp program for this season, the staff and Board of Directors of Bear Creek Camp quickly grappled with the challenge. They moved toward new ministry opportunities that could still provide for the safety and health of their community. Two programs emerged from their work: **Family Vacation Rentals** and the **Bear Creek Camp Conservation Corps** (BCCCC).

Family Vacation Rentals was a unique opportunity for families to visit the camp, stay in cabins, eat meals prepared carry-out style, and enjoy the nearly 3000 acres of forest and streams through swimming, hiking, and relaxing time together.

Assembly 2020 - A New Way of Being Church Together

Friday evening, October 16 & Sunday afternoon, October 18 Friday evening, October 23 & Saturday morning and afternoon, October 24

Because of concern for the safety of the voting members in this time of pandemic, Assembly 2020, including the election of a bishop, will be conducted online. The Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod is not the first to hold an online assembly this year; and based on the experience of other synods, especially the South Carolina Synod, the assembly planning team has full confidence that our assembly will be able to conduct its business and elections efficiently and in good order.

We have a production team, Events Staging, that has worked with our synod for a number of years to produce the video for our in-person assemblies. And we also have contracted with Lumi, a tech firm that specializes in online voting and that has been used by the ELCA for churchwide assemblies as well as by other synods for their local assemblies. With the support of these teams, and with the hard work of synod staff and some willing volunteers, Assembly 2020 promises to be a groundbreaking event!

How will this work?

The entire assembly will be broadcast live and can be viewed by anyone with an internet connection. Voting members will need to register and will be given individual credentials to login to a more tailored experience, including the ability to vote, ask questions, and speak to resolutions or other matters. For "visitors" - those who simply wishes to watch the proceedings - unlike past years, there is no need to register.

What do I need to participate?

To participate as a voting member you will need a reliable internet connection, for example, one that can watch a YouTube video without problems. You will also need either a desktop or laptop computer with a microphone and camera. It will be possible for two or more people to share a computer; however, each individual will need a separate device (like a smartphone or tablet) in order to vote.

What if I'm not very tech savvy?

The assembly planning team is working to make participation as simple as possible. Detailed written instructions, as well as an instructional video, will be sent to each voting member well before the assembly. There also will be an opportunity to login to an orientation session prior to the actual assembly in order to discover and fix any issues a voting member might encounter. Finally, there will be a support line to contact a tech team for individual help with any question or problem.



If your congregation has not yet selected its voting members, volunteer to participate in this exciting new experience.
