Any correspondence will come <u>ONLY</u> from Pastor's cell or the church office number. We apologize for the issue.






GSLC is excited to invite you to this NEW event on Saturday, December 6th from 6-8pm.



Holly is sometimes used instead of –or with the evergreen. The sharp points of the holly remind us of Christ's crown of thorns. The red berries remind us of His Blood. There is a story that holly berries were white until Christ's Blood fell on them—causing them to be red.
