I remember Easter growing up at Jordan Lutheran church. You always had to get new church clothes, and back then it was a suit. Unfortunately it was a wool suit that itched. I did not like it! Easter worship service was a long, long sermon and communion took awhile. No intinction back then, we had regular communion with the Pastor doing everything. Church was packed and the sanctuary seemed brighter.

Easter is called the Queen of all church festivals. I remember in Seminary how my preaching professor told us how all history before Jesus came to a point at the cross and resurrection and after that exploded outward. Easter is that to us.

Jesus' death on the cross meant our sins were forgiven and He began the last fight against death. His resurrection sealed the victory over death. Death was defeated. Do you remember what He told Martha before He raised Lazarus from the grave? Jesus told her: "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." Do you believe this?

Jesus rose from the grave, not with all the scars of his torture except with 5 wounds from the crucifixion. He rose with a resurrected body. Paul tells us that because He rose, we shall rise also. So this Holy Week, walk with Jesus to the cross: with the Stations on Wednesday, Maundy Thursday service, and the Tenebrae on Good Friday. Join us to celebrate the great Festival of Easter—Jesus' Resurrection.


