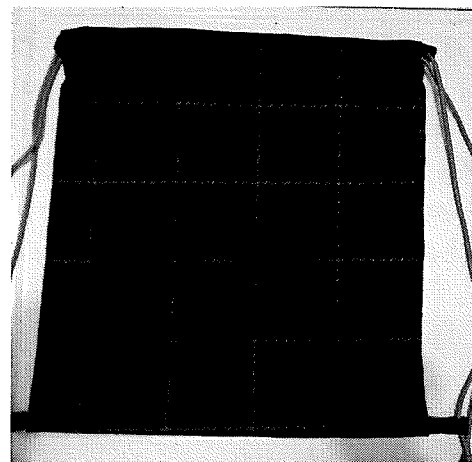
Mardi Gras Talent Show & Pot Luck

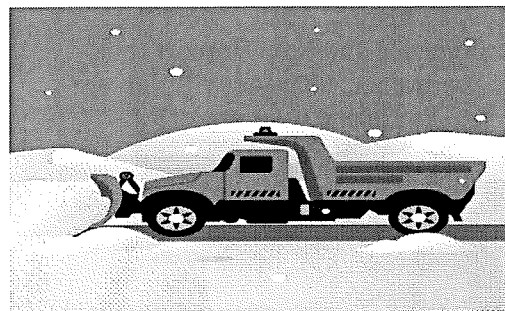
FIRST HOLY COMMUNION
