Diane's Blueberry Crumb Cake

Preheat oven to 350 Grease and flour a 9 x13 pan



3 cups flour 4–1/2 tsp white vinegar

2 cups sugar 1 tsp vanilla extract

1/2 tsp salt
1-1/2 sticks of margarine, softened
1tsp baking soda
1 cup milk

120z of fresh blueberries or 1 can rinsed and drained

### Instructions:

In a large bowl mix the flour, sugar, salt and margarine with a pastry blender or fork until crumbs form. Reserve and set aside 1/2 cup of crumbs for topping. Add baking soda and the vinegar to the milk. Add the milk mixture to the remaining dry ingredients, then add the eggs and vanilla and mix well. Fold in blueberries. Pour the batter into the prepared pan and sprinkle with the 1/2 cup of reserved crumbs. Bake for 40–45 minutes. This cake freezes well!

\*note You may also use 2–8 x 8 pans. If you do please reserve 2/3 cup of the crumbs so you have enough for both pans. Keep one and share the other!
